And he will share with us his heavenly kingdom!



Matthew 28:1-10



Come, Christians, follow where our Savior trod, the Lamb victorious, Christ, the Son of God. {Refrain}


O Lord, once lifted on the tree of pain, draw all the world to seek you once again. {Refrain}
