Prayer for unaccompanied children

Jesus, Humble Servant-

I'm thinking of a young man (a boy, really) separated from his parents (they were worried) in search of something important (nobody understood). This young man took on the responsibility of caring for himself in the midst of foreboding faces. He was seeking wisdom and belonging, discovering his identity and calling (and turned out to have plenty of wisdom to share along the way). The separation was painful (his mom was so worried) and risky (he wasn't really old enough) but it was one necessary step towards harmony and flourishing for the people he loved.

The young man (of course) is you, [slipping away from your parents](#) in the chaos of a caravan and returning to the temple alone.

But he is also the 118,938 unaccompanied children who entered the United States without a legal guardian last year, and the hundreds of thousands in the years before that. [More than half of them](#) are teenage boys. They are taking on the responsibility of caring for themselves in the midst of a foreboding system, seeking safety and support, searching for identity and calling. The separations - whether undertaken by choice, necessity, or coercion - are painful and risky, but hold promises of harmony and flourishing.

I struggle to comprehend the circumstances and experiences that would lead to such a choice, much as I question your decision to stay behind while your parents began their journey. Help me hold in solemn honor the acts of desperation bound in hope taken by parents who send, children who go, family, friends, and foster parents who receive.



Jesus, Righteous King–

We ask for your powerful help and righteous intervention on behalf of these your little brothers and sisters.

May the system tasked with stewarding them prevent harm, not cause it.

May people who wish to do them harm be held accountable.

May the individuals in direct care and supervision of them act in justice and mercy, and may they be cared for themselves.

May those of us with voices we can raise do so with winsome confidence.

May your church arise in abundant welcome for these young people in whom are embodied all at once the orphan, the poor, and the foreigner—and who have so much wisdom to share.

The eyes of all look to you in hope: meet our every need, we pray.

We ask for paths to safety, and that both government entities and private sponsor groups would be moved to provide welcome.

We pray for understanding and goodwill among those who work for policy solutions. We pray for those with power and influence to leverage those privileges to empower the flourishing of both immigrants and native born citizens.

Prayer for advocates and peacemakers
